President's Message – Ted Thome

I played 18 holes on Sunday. Wow!!! Mother Nature has really cooperated. Besides the warm spring like day, it looks like we received just enough rain last week to make our little piece of heaven come to life. The fairways have started to lose that winter brown tinge and most greens look absolutely fabulous. The good soaking has even made some of the greens a little more forgiving, which usually makes golf more fun. Obviously more rain won't hurt, but as of now the course is in great shape.

The unusual warm weather coaxed a lot of golfers from the couch so the course was pretty busy. The Tee Sheet was full all weekend, and I saw numerous families on the course. What a great place to spend a Sunday with your kids. As the weather warms up, the course will see even more play as many Members will want to experience one of the better times of the year to be out there. Member usage is definitely good for OGCC. A busy club is a healthy club on many social and financial levels.

Speaking of good health, the OGCC Membership Drive was more successful than anyone planning the program even imagined. Listed below are some of the big picture benefits we realized to date from "The Drive".

- We sold Memberships to approximately 20 NEW members and one Social Member.
- We converted nine leasing members to Proprietary members
- We collected \$115,500 in new Capital contributions which will be saved for future club improvements.
- Seven Proprietary sellers were converted to Social Memberships meaning they will continue to support the club in some fashion. We thank them for that.
- All OGCC owned Memberships that we targeted to sell, were sold, including any that were leased.
- We helped approximately 20 struggling members on the sell list. There are still a few left willing to sell for \$4,000, but not as many as only one month ago
- We were able to collect some Past Due accounts.
- We helped one member looking for a temporary reprieve, lease out his memberships by selling an OGCC owned membership that had been leased.

The "Membership Drive" will be even more successful if we are able to continue to sell memberships using the \$1,000 discount through April 1. Additionally, we anticipate leasing memberships, thereby increasing our pipeline of potential future Members. Overall, the program was a great success. However the greatest success will come from welcoming new Members, and converting them to friends. We can always get stronger, but in the last month have made great strides toward a healthier, more vibrant club, for the long term.

Don't forget, the annual ACORN CLUB season begins this weekend. This club is open to all members, at any golf level. It is a great way to compete, but more importantly, meet new people and have fun. If you are not familiar with ACORN CLUB, I encourage you to see Rick or Mike Dowd for details.

It's the best time of the year to be out there, so I'll see you at the club.

The roller coaster ride continues regarding the re-alignment of Stearns Road and the Redevelopment Agency with the latest being up. The City Council has voted to take over the agency and to move forward with the new road alignment so we owe a tremendous amount of gratitude to Mayor Pat Paul and her Council. As of now, it looks like OID will be moving the existing water line they have going from Stearns Road to Maag next month and then the bidding to build the road will start the following month. The meeting will last about 30 minutes and we will present curb cut ideas for future entrances coming off of the new Stearns Road alignment since Bill Kull, the road engineer, needs these now. General Manager - Rick Schultz

It's hard to believe that it's been 1811 days that I've been with OGCC. For those that like smaller numbers, it will be my 5 year anniversary on February 14th – my how time flies! I'm extremely pleased with how much we have gotten accomplished over the 5 years and I look forward to many more years!

The AT&T cell tower is up and running so all of you on AT&T's service should be very happy – all of the employees with iPhones at the club love it! I'm still hoping that a few more carriers will jump on the tower as well so we can get some more rent coming in from the tower.

I'm very pleased that the Board of Directors agreed to give another five \$2,000 club credits to new buyers as we have sold another 4 memberships and I hope to have the 5th and final one sold by the first part of February. If you do know anyone looking to buy, tell them to get their applications in quickly! Members that sponsor a new buyer still receive \$250 for the first buyer and \$500 for everyone after that. So far one member has gotten \$2,750 in referrals – way to go!!! The Board also agreed to give anyone who buys or leases a membership before April 1st a \$1,000 club credit; so we will be pushing membership sales all throughout winter! Between last month and this month, we have 29 new members that are excited and are ready to support OGCC for the next 50 years.

With the first quarter of our fiscal year behind us we find ourselves over \$10,000 ahead of budget in operations and overall we are over \$100,000 ahead when you add in the capital income and expenses. Revenues are up in the food and beverage department and Chef Dan and his crew are controlling the cost of goods sold which is the main reason we are ahead of budget year to date!

In our ongoing quest to improve service, we have moved our present Bar Manager, Chris Carroll, into the Assistant F & B Director position under Chef Dan. Chris will focus on bringing the bar and the restaurant staff together to better serve all of you and he will work one on one with each employee to better train and hone their service skills. Chris has worked in private country clubs for many years so he knows what it takes to be a top notch service organization. I do want to thank Christina Ingram for her many years of service and we all wish her the best in the future.

We've already had a meeting with the Men's Invitational committee for their tournament on June 21 – 23 and with a Vegas theme this year, I see fun for all once again! Jeff Sceville is this year's tournament chairman and it looks like most of the event and playing formats will be the same. There is talk of a casino night on Friday night; which will be really fun. You will be able to sign up ahead of time again if you sponsor the tournament. The sign up date is on April 14th – the same day as the OGCC One Day Invitational. Look for more info out soon.

Hopefully we'll get some rain and snow this month as the course could use it almost as much as the ranchers and farmers. The course has greened back up some from our last storm but for us to get the course striped up again, we'll need more rain. The silver lining to the lack of rain is that our rounds are up by 22% over last year which is partly why our food and beverage revenue is up so much. Oh heck, before we all know it, we'll be sitting in 100 degree heat and wishing for cold weather and I'll be telling you it's my 6th anniversary – boy how time flies! Enjoy the month and I hope to see you out at the club.

From the Lesson Tee... Mike Dowd

Our new teaching brochures for 2012 are hot off the presses, available in the golf shop, and on our website – www.oakdalegcc.org. We have instruction programs that will appeal to all ages and ability levels as well as a busy schedule of group clinics and camps. Of particular interest to those of you with children and grandchildren locally will likely be our **Acorn Academy** Program. Keeping in line with our focus on making our club not only the best place for kids to be introduced to the game, but simultaneously a destination for young players that want to play at the next level, our 2012 program offers something unmatched in our area. As a student in the Academy you receive not only one private lesson each week with your primary instructor, but unlimited participation in our 3 Academy Open Access Group Workshops that are held every week. Thursdays will be on the full swing, Fridays on the short game, and Saturdays on putting. This gives each student the potential to receive instruction up to 4 times per week if they so desire. It will be offered in two 4 ½ month semesters (February 1st to June 15th & August 1st to December 15th), but students may also sign up on a month-by-month basis. Golfers, ages 9 to 19, are eligible to participate, but the program is limited to the first 24 students. I think it will be a great addition to the slate of programs that we already offer, so if you have a young player that wants to get serious about the game, enroll them in The Acorn Academy here at OGCC and unlock their potential!

Wednesday February 22nd I will be hosting **The Mind Game** workshop here at the club at 6:00 PM. This will be a 2 hour interactive workshop that is designed to help give you answers to mental roadblocks that you experience in the game as well as to give you a roadmap to developing the “5 Keys” to a solid mind game and enjoying golf more. Those who sign up will be asked to email me in advance with one personal mental stumbling block that they would like to overcome as a result of the workshop and we will discuss all of them anonymously during the event along with processes for over-coming them. Cost to participate will be \$35 and includes hors'd'oeuvres and a copy of one of three different golf books on the mind game that you get to chose from. Call the pro shop or email me to sign up. Greens Committee – Bonnie Booker

We want to welcome all of our new members to Oakdale Golf and Country Club. We look forward to meeting you and seeing you on the golf course.

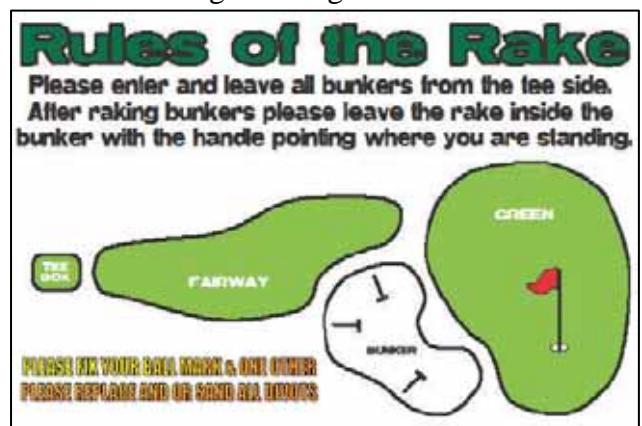
Until then, we thought it would be a good time to refresh everyone on some basic golf etiquette and to clear up a few misconceptions that many of you may have in regard to our bunkers. Basically, etiquette boils down to respecting the golfers you're playing with, golfers who are playing ahead of you, and golfers behind you.

Most golfers learn early on that they should rake after playing a stroke from a bunker. Smoothing out the footprints and depressions is a task that should be done every time. But many golfers are unaware that there is more to good bunker etiquette than simply raking the surface.

You should always enter and exit a bunker on the low side. Climbing in and out of the high side of bunkers causes major damage to the bunker face and the surrounding side. Follow the same path in and out of the bunker to reduce the amount of raking necessary to prepare the surface for the next player. Take the time to fix the damage that you have caused and any nearby damage someone else might have left behind.

Always use a rake to smooth the sand surface. Trying to smooth footprints and depressions with your foot or the back of your club accomplishes very little and is not appropriate. When raking sand toward the edge of the bunker do not pull large amounts of sand over the bunkers edge. Doing so can result in damage to mowing equipment.

Although the USGA recommends placing the rake outside the bunker, Oakdale Golf and Country Clubs policy is to leave the rake inside the bunker. This makes it easier for maintenance equipment to move around the bunker. The rakes should be placed away from the target line between the fairway and the green. This is to reduce the chance of the rake influencing a player's ball. The handle of the rake should be placed near the bunkers edge. When possible, place the rake in the flat portion of the bunker. If the rake is placed on a steep face of the bunker it can easily result in a golf ball lodging against the rake on



the upslope. When the rake is moved the ball could possibly move and then will have to be replaced under the rules of golf. The above diagram of "Rules of the Rake" will be placed in the golf carts for future reference. Bunker maintenance is an extremely expensive part of taking care of our course. Golfers can free up workers for many other tasks by simply practicing good bunker etiquette. Your efforts in bunker etiquette will be greatly appreciated by your fellow golfers!

Operations Committee – Tom Brennan

As most of you have heard the club was able to sell the 25 memberships with the \$2,000.00 credit back offer in about a week. Rick has made the Board aware that we had a few other memberships that belonged to members wanting or needing to sell. He requested that the Board consider offering 5 additional memberships with the same incentives. At the January 18, 2012 Board meeting we discussed the merits and concerns about extending the offer to 5 more sales. There were only a couple of members at the Board meeting and when asked, they were supportive of the additional sales. The Board approved selling 5 more memberships with the \$2,000.00 account credit. We also approved that any additional memberships that were sold before April 1, 2012 would be given a \$1,000.00 credit back. In an attempt to encourage someone who may be considering the 1-year lease option, we approved a match of the \$1,000.00 initiation fee. If the lease is started before April 1, 2012 and at the end of the year they choose to purchase a full membership.

FYI: As of this writing Rick has informed the Board that he is close to selling the additional 5 memberships. We should all be proud that in these challenging economic times our Club has been able to keep a full membership, with reasonable dues and maintain such great conditions.

The second topic that Operations has been looking into is the legal issues of allowing our Bar to sell alcohol to members for "off premise" consumption. This has been brought to our attention that some members have purchased bottles of wine to take home at the end of the quarter in order to use up their minimums. These types of purchases are different than our Wine Tasting events where a special 1-day off site permit is purchased. We have asked Rick to get the facts about what is allowed and required for us to be in compliance with the law and to protect the Club's alcohol license.

Course Maintenance – Mike Olson

Thank goodness for some rain. It felt good to do a happy dance for a few days. It sure beats the frost that we have experienced the last month. I hope we have more "happy dance" days coming.

We have finished the block work around the flower beds left of #1 and behind #5 tee, reshaped and brought down the edge, or lip, surrounding the two bunkers by #5 and #6 greens. We will continue to move sand and reshape the floors of all traps before adding new sand. We also started concrete work for material bunkers and storage in the maintenance yard.

The guys on the crew and I would like to thank the Board and Membership for the upgrades to our break room. It's nice to have an area for lunch and meetings where everyone is able to sit down; as you can see by the photo.



Reminder: It is so important this time of year to repair your ball-marks on the green and replace your divots in the fairway when possible!! I know different courses have different etiquette depending on their climate, turf type and time of year. The correct way to repair your divot any time of year at our course is if you take a divot and it stays together enough that you are able to replace it, please do so instead of putting down sand. That divot will grow back ten times faster than any sand or sand and seed mix you try to replace it with. The only time that I recommend putting sand in your divot is after you have replaced the sod or if your divot has disappeared or blown apart in too many pieces.

Our sales for January might come in a little short of the budget as we had a couple more banquets last year. Those banquets really helped out and that drove my decision to run the small special dinners which did work to pull sales up pretty close to budget. Cost of goods sold will be higher than projected in January due to the lack of banquet business as well. Those banquets help keep the COGS down because our margins on banquets are significantly higher than our regular a la carte menu which in turn, allows us to keep the menu pricing down and offer a lot of the lower price specials - it's kind of a tightrope balancing act. The numbers will still look good year to date.

We are opening up for Valentine's Day dinner on Tuesday the 14th with a special menu just for that evening. Please make your reservations early so we can plan our staffing needs accordingly. I have some other small special dinners planned and I have them listed below.

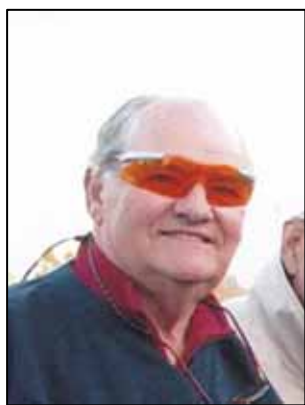
There are now 15 back on the sale list with 11 for sale at \$4000. There are also 15 on the list to lease so there are plenty of opportunities for new buyers!
